

## Change in 'Action': Cayuga/Seneca agency celebrating 50 years with Auburn museum exhibit

"Fifty Years of Community Action" will be celebrated and illustrated in the next exhibit at the Cayuga Museum.

"People Helping People: Celebrating 50 Years of Community Action" will open from 5 to 8 p.m. First Friday, April 3.

The exhibit tells the story of community action in Cayuga and Seneca counties, from the War on Poverty that birthed the program to the current challenges of hunger, housing,

employment and more that continue to face the nation — and that the Cayuga/Seneca Community Action Agency combats locally every day.

"Community action has grown from a staff of three in 1965 to over 125 employees today serving two counties and over 5,000 customers annually through multiple self-sufficiency programs," agency Executive Director Laurie Piccolo said in a news release.

The agency will also host a 50th Anniversary Celebration from 5:30 to 7 p.m. Thursday, May 7, at the museum, 203 Genesee St., Auburn. The exhibit continues until May 24.

Admission to the opening reception is free and open to the public; admission during regular museum hours is a \$5 donation.
